Konrad Mägi

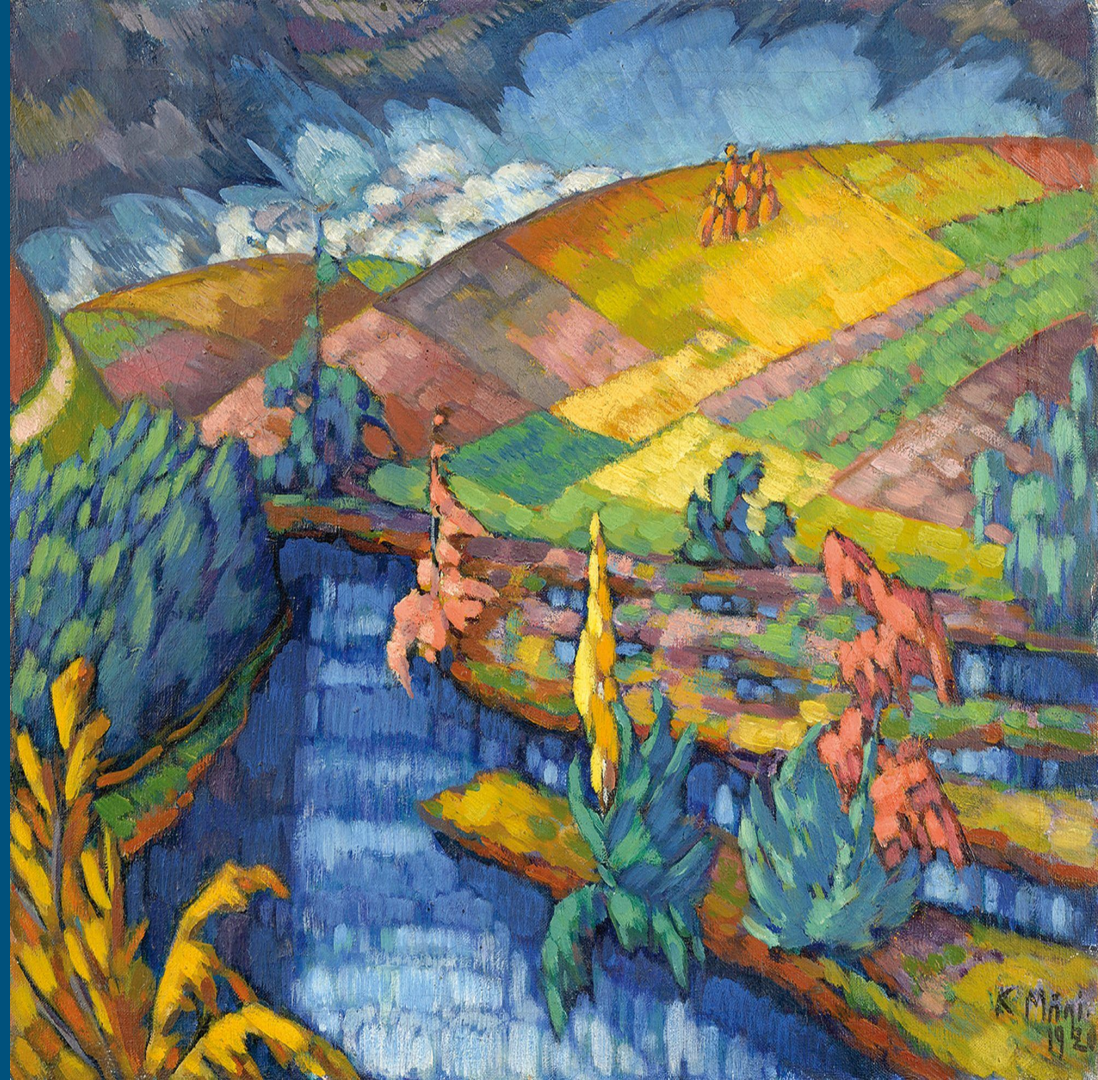
- Konrad Vilhelm Mägi

 - Oil painting

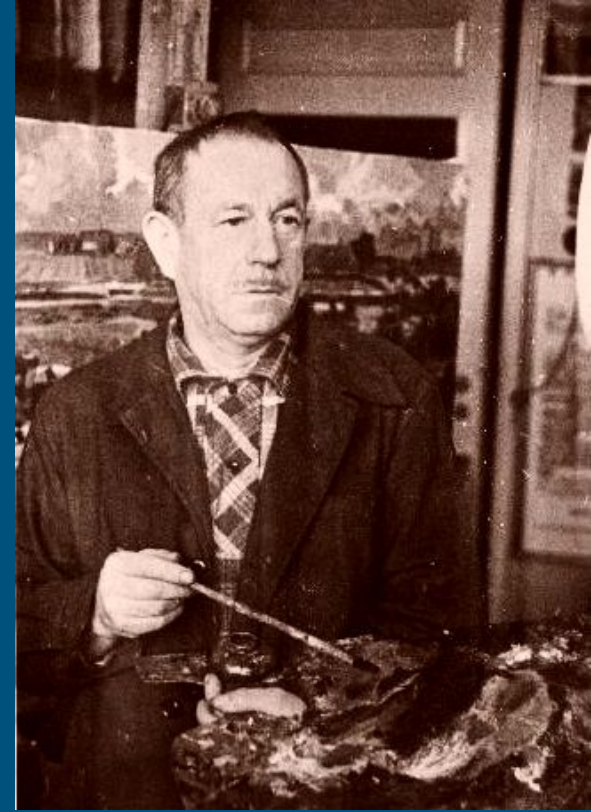


-
